

World Book Day 2024

Before half term, we launched our plans for World Book Day 2024. Each child was provided with a goody bag which contained 2 wooden spoons, a dialogue scroll and a £1 World Book Day voucher. We are encouraging the children to choose their favourite book which they will bring to school on World Book Day this Thursday 7th March.

The children are asked to choose their favourite book at the moment and then choose their two favourite characters from their story alongside their favourite dialogue. They can decorate their spoons to make them look like their chosen characters using any art materials. Here are a couple of examples:
